Case Summary

Trial Phase

Mpambara was indicted and tried on three counts before the ICTR.

Count 1: Genocide: Not Guilty

The Chamber found Mpambara not guilty for genocide.

The Chamber found that the evidence presented by the Prosecution did not prove beyond reasonable doubt that Mpambara actively participated in, or was present during, the attacks on Gahini hospital on 9 April 1994.

Count 2: Complicity in Genocide: Not Guilty

The Chamber found Mpambara not guilty of complicity in genocide.

The Chamber did not find beyond reasonable doubt that the failure to arrest looters and otherwise protect Rukara parish demonstrated Mpambara's involvement with other persons to commit genocide.

Count 3: Crime Against Humanity (Extermination): Not Guilty

The Chamber found Mpambara not guilty for extermination as a crime against humanity. The Chamber found that it was not proven beyond reasonable doubt that Mpambara distributed weapons

and incited genocide at Paris Center on the morning of 9 April 1994.

Sentence

The Chamber acquitted Mpambara on all counts.
